



Application for a Dwelling Entitlement Search

A dwelling entitlement is a provision that allows for the erection of a dwelling house on land in the following zones: *RU1 Primary Production; RU2 Rural Landscape; RU4 Primary Production Small Lots;* and, *E3 Environmental Management*. Not all properties have a legal right to build a dwelling on them. Dwelling Entitlements can be dependent upon zoning, lot size and date of subdivision approval.

Use this form to request a dwelling entitlement search for a property located within the Singleton Local Government Area. A determination will be made as to whether a property has a legal right to construct a dwelling, and a written response will be sent to the postal address nominated on this form.
