### **Background**

It is intended Singleton Council, through the Mount Thorley Warkworth Historic Heritage Conservation Fund (MTWHHCF), will open heritage funding rounds Q4 in 2018. These grants are designed to assist all residents and community groups of the Singleton LGA wishing to advance public, private and community heritage, small or large in nature, under the following broad categories;

- Community Heritage Projects
- Major Works
- Heritage Reports
- Heritage emergency works
- Education
- Technology

### **Singleton MTWHHCF categories:**

#### **Community Heritage Projects**

Purpose: To facilitate the delivery of projects and programs that support the promotion, protection, maintenance and celebration of heritage in Singleton LGA or to deliver engaging projects that support community groups, to promote, protect and celebrate heritage across Singleton LGA.

Funding available: Up to \$30,000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: No

#### **Major Works**

Purpose: To protect, conserve, maintain, enhance and celebrate items listed on the Local Heritage Register.

Funding available: \$10,000 to \$30,000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: Yes



### **Heritage Reports**

Purpose: To enhance the quality and coverage of conservation documents and management reports for items listed on the Local Heritage Register / Local Environment Plan.

Funding available: Up to \$5,000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: No

### **Heritage Emergency Works**

To avert immediate risk of further damage caused by unexpected events to the heritage values of a Local / State Heritage Register-listed item or item with a current Interim Heritage Order. Application in this category is to be made directly and immediately to Singleton Council outlining the nature of emergency works, the reason and cause of the emergency ie flood, tree incursion/collapse, accident, animal incursion etc. and expected works necessary to make safe.

Funding available: Up to \$15,000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: No

### **Education**

Purpose: Open to schools developing educational programmes around local heritage that directly benefits students and advances local heritage skills and knowledge.

Funding available: Up to \$5000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: No

### **Technology**

Purpose: Open to businesses, community organisations or individuals creating immersive/interactive/responsive/ heritage systems, processes or mobile applications regarding local heritage.

Funding available: Up to \$5000 (per project ex GST)

Matching funding required: No



## Application Process

Applications are to be addressed to **Singleton Council** listing the **category** under which funding is sought. The application must be accompanied by a description of the project, activity or function for consideration; the outcomes likely delivered and the stage at which the funding is proposed for (where long term projects exist funding may be used to assist with only one or two aspects of the total); where building works are planned a set of detailed plans and costing estimates are needed, or funding can be accessed to produce these plans.

Once Council has received the application and registered it for consideration, it will be passed to the Singleton Council's Heritage Advisor for review. A recommendation will then be provided back the Singleton Council and Mount Thorley Warkworth (MTW). A recommendation will then be forwarded to the Singleton Heritage Advisory Committee (SHAC) for review. The assessment should be completed in the month in which the application is received. Council in association with MTW will review the recommendation provided by SHAC and make the final funding decision. A recommendation will then be provided to Council through the minutes of the SHAC meeting. Once MTW have agreed to funding applicants, successful applicants will be notified by email / mail and funds distributed.
